FROM THE KITCHENETTE OF EL PRESIDENTE'

I have some fabulous news following the Council Meeting of 31st May 2022. The following was adopted:

Item 4: WestInvest Program

"Council endorsed in principle the proposed list of projects for application under the Blue Mountains Local Government Allocation, as listed in Attachment 1 as:

Lomatia Park Clubhouse and Amenities Upgrade - \$3,500,000

The currently proposed project list for Council's applications under the Community Projects Grants - Competitive Round was attached to the report. Proposed applications by other eligible organisations for the Community Projects Grants - Competitive Round, for assets on Council owned or controlled lands require a current 2022 support letter / email from Council and that the required Council support for the application will be contingent on several factors including the proposal aligning with the relevant Council Master Plan, Plan of Management or other Strategy or Asset Management Plan and not imposing any additional costs on Council.

This means the clubhouse building upgrade has secured funding! We are still required to put an application into West Invest. This means it won't be part of the competitive process, it will be taken out of the dollar allocation Council receives automatically. We will put in touch after November when Westinvest provides the allocation to start the planning process. DA still going through approval process at present.

I feel this is great news and we are finally seeing this come to fruition"

These are first steps, but this is the furthest we have ever gotten into the process since 1984 when the then President, Glen Jobson, first entered into talks with the BMCC. Wil and AT have been negotiating this over many years and finally some light at the end of the tunnel.
